Lionfish Roundup - On July 13th, the River Center was the southern event site for the Martin County Artificial Reef Lionfish Roundup. Congratulations to Albrey Arrington and the Fish Rules App team who won the Round-Up's awards for "Most Lionfish Caught" and "Smallest Lionfish"! They caught 73 lionfish and their smallest lionfish was 5 inches.





Special Story Times – EllieBellie's Sunshine Shop Storytime

Elora and Isabella Fucigna are two teen girls that have started their own business dedicated to promoting literacy in our community. They illustrate beautiful watercolor greeting cards, and sell them to local area gift shops including the River Center. They use the proceeds from the cards to purchase books for schools and libraries. They also made a donation to the River Center to purchase books for our "library". On July 11th they came

to a special story time to share their love of books with our Story Time guests.

Sunset Paddle - On Tuesday July 16th the River Center led a tour of the Loxahatchee River at Jonathan Dickinson State Park for 25 guests. The River Center provided our kayaks and others brought their own kayaks, canoes and paddleboards. The guests enjoyed a leisurely hour and a half paddle that included short talks about mangroves, oyster restoration, sea grass, water color and quality, fish, turtles, and more. This new activity was a success based on the numbers of calls we received the next day from members wanting to sign up for the next kayak trip on August 30.

Summer Programs

Fishing Clinic for Kids and Families – Two more sessions of the popular River Center fishing clinic took place on July 19th in Carlin Park and again at Burt Reynolds Park on July 27th. Thirty kids and their parents/guardians came out to learn the basics of fishing –

tackle, knots, fish identification, regulations, and more. Fishing Headquarters tackle shop and the West Palm Beach Fishing Club donated all of the fishing equipment, including 20 fishing poles, and



informational books about fish identification and conservation. Fish Rules App donated all the bait supplies for this summer's clinics. Bubba Gump Shrimp Co. restaurant also provided the River Center with meal vouchers for the young participants. The event received great promotion and press such as the "top pick" on Macaroni Kid Palm Beach Gardens/Jupiter and prominent placement in the Jupiter Courier. Building on our successful platform for teaching fishing skills, we incorporated the requirements from the Boy Scouts of America to provide a fishing merit badge program to a Boy Scout troops.

Summer Camps – The River Center offered another highly successful week of camp where campers hiked, fished, and kayaked at Riverbend Park, explored at Jonathan Dickinson State Park and Hobe Sound Nature Center, seine and dip netted in the Indian River Lagoon at Coral Cove Park, swam at Blowing Rocks Preserve, and snorkeled and explored the mangrove habitats at DuBois Park. We had two more sold-out *mini-aquatic camps* as well. The River Center's partner camps with both *Jupiter Outdoor Center* and *Blueline Paddle-Surf* have also provided successful environmental education programs.

Outreach

Treetop Academy – An interactive Loxahatchee River program was provided for 50 pre-school students at the Treetop Academy in Jupiter. The experience included a touch tank demonstration, bio-facts, and games about the Loxahatchee River.
