

As we put 2014 into the history books, it is important to review the hydrologic conditions in the Loxahatchee River over the past year. This information is valuable as we summarize and interpret our water quality, seagrass and oyster monitoring data. Throughout the year we observe the full spectrum of conditions in the Loxahatchee. During the peak of the dry season we are often clamoring for water to protect the freshwater swamps from saltwater intrusion. During the wet season our focus shifts to the health of the estuary as huge volumes of freshwater enters the system.
