On Friday, November 6th, the River Center welcomed Ms. Wendy Puz from the Palm Beach County Department of Environmental Resources Management. Wendy gave a presentation about restoration efforts at the Lake Worth Lagoon. She then discussed how these efforts benefit the local wildlife and enhance the recreational value of the area. Included in her presentation were ways to enjoy these natural areas and to help protect them and make them better. There were 43 participants that attended this program.

From habitat activities to knot tying, casting practice to fish dissections, all topics were covered in order to prepare the girls for fishing. After the morning activities the girls finally got to test their newly acquired knowledge and went fishing. Atlantic University, gave a wonderful and informative presentation about our nocturnal friends, bats! Inside the center guests had a chance to create their own bats and paint pictures using spider rings in the classroom. Guests were invited to explore the exhibits inside the center, touch animals in the touch tank, and discover various plants and animals in the migratory bird and butterfly garden. The camp fire was roaring all night, as families roasted marshmallows and enjoyed delicious s'mores throughout the evening.

Liberty Park Elementary Field Ranger Program


The Science Department of Palm Beach County School District has teamed up with R.I.S.E. Organizations (Resources in Science Education) to offer children an adventure in learning and exploration they will remember for a life-time! This unique experience takes them beyond the four walls of their classroom and into the great outdoors with their family and friends to become an official Field Research Ranger of the Palm Beach County School District. Students visit each participating RISE organization, complete the on-site Field Research Ranger activity, and bring the completed passport booklet to the district office to receive their certification and the official Field Research Ranger patch. 
Ranger certification process children throughout Palm Beach County experience nature walks, scavenger hunts, geocaching, and a variety of other hands-on learning activities supporting science and the discovery of Florida's natural resources and unique ecosystems. On Saturday, October 10th, students from Liberty Park Elementary School from West Palm Beach came to the River Center to complete our portion of the passport. Thirty two students and their families came to explore the River Center, participate in a touch tank demonstration, learn about our water resources, and balanced the water budget.

River Center's Adult Environmental Education Program

Last year, the Loxahatchee River District's River Center launched a new program for adults in our community who wished to recapture the excitement and educational experiences of their childhood field trips. The Adult Environmental Education Series is designed for adults to have an interactive "behind-the-scenes" experience at the River Center while gaining insight and knowledge into an environmental topic of local interest, all while under the personalized guidance of the Center's expert staff.



The River Center started the fall/winter series on Thursday, October 8th with our Wonders of Water: Water Properties Lab. Participants worked in an interactive lab that covered the properties of water including: density, buoyancy, surface tension, and the phases of water based on two different water types. Participants discovered the connection of salt, fresh, and brackish water to the ecosystems in the





demonstrated the phases of the water cycle and its connections to all living things.

SUBJECT: Approval of the Friends of the Loxahatchee River 2016 Budget

The Loxahatchee River Environmental Center is operated as a partnership between the Loxahatchee River and the Friends of the Loxahatchee River, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit. The Friends of the Loxahatchee River works to pay a portion of the River Center's operation and staff costs. The Friends of the Loxahatchee River generate revenue through sponsorships, donations, program fees and memberships. The Friends of the Loxahatchee River fiscal year is January 1 through December 31.

The proposed budget for 2016 is provided, and outlines the River Center's year-to-date fiscal performance for 2015 and provides projections for 2016 income and expenses. Staff and membership of the Friends of the Loxahatchee River request your support of the proposed 2016 Budget.
