International Coastal Cleanup (30th Anniversary) –On Saturday, September 19th the River Center at Coral Cove Park joined The Ocean Conservancy and Keep Palm Beach County Beautiful for the 30th anniversary of the International Coastal Cleanup, a global event that mobilizes hundreds of thousands of people to take action for our ocean. It is the world's largest volunteer beach cleanup. By joining the movement for Trash Free Seas, volunteers helped clean up trash already in the ocean and shoreline and worked to reduce their own trash impact before it happens. Ocean trash compromises the health of humans, wildlife, and the economies that depend on a healthy ocean. Every piece of trash volunteers found was tracked and



included in an annual index of global marine debris to be released in 2016. A special thank you goes out to the wonderful volunteers that joined us Saturday morning!
