## **Special Programs**

Family Seine and Snorkel-On Saturday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, the River Center presented a Family Seine and Snorkel event at Coral Cove Park. Families joined River Center environmental educators for a morning of exploration in estuary waters. Participants got some relief from the heat in the cool water while River Center educators guided guests on a snorkel trip through the seagrass and mangroves, while discovering some critters along the way. Pufferfish, conchs, and sea urchins are just a few of the animals that participants were able to experience up close and personal during our morning adventure! Educators welcomed over 24 adults and children to this event. The event was free to attend!

River Center Public Kayak Tour-On Tuesday May 17th, the River Center hosted a public kayak tour of Riverbend Park. Our kayak tour was to celebrate the 31st Anniversary of the "Wild and Scenic" designation of the Loxahatchee River. What better way to celebrate than kayaking! It was a beautiful day on the river with great weather and great company, led by all River Center staff. We had a total of 9 participants for this event.

## Girl Scouts Eco-Action Workshop "Fish Like a Girl"

June 18 – 8:30a-4:30p: About Boating Safely: While boating can be a fun and relaxing experience, operating a boat, especially for young people, can be dangerous. This issue was brought to light last summer when Austin Stephanos and his good friend were lost at sea. In hopes of preventing similar tragedies the River Center is collaborating with the US Coast Guard Auxiliary "Flotilla 52" to provide Boating Safely Classes targeted specifically to young boaters in our community. These classes are provided through a generous sponsorship by the AustinBlu Foundation, a not-for-profit founded in Austin's name and dedicated to raising awareness and promoting educational programs to improve boater safety. Participating in effective boater safety training is the most significant thing boaters can do to decrease their risk of mishap while on the water. Potential boaters need to understand the dangers of boating in hazardous waters like the Jupiter Inlet. Although there is no cost for the class, a \$10.00 deposit per student is required to reserve a seat. This deposit will be refunded in full to all students who complete the class. Please bring a lunch. Pre-registration is required because space is limited. Registration will take place promptly at 8:00, the morning of class.
