# Creature Feature: Lookdown

Lookdowns are schooling fish found in western Atlantic waters ranging from Maine to south Brazil.

These unique fish are easily identified by their silver or golden color, exceptionally thin body, and scythe-shaped fins.

As juveniles Lookdowns feature long. thread like rays that extend from their dorsal and pelvic fins.

Although Lookdowns have been recorded at up to 3 lbs they generally range between 1 to 1 1/4 lbs and grow up to 12 inches in length.

Lookdowns are found in both marine and brackish water, but prefer a warm, shallow, inshore habitat with a soft bottom. Lookdowns feed on small fish, shrimp, squid, and crabs.
